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<u>City of Orange Eisteddfod – General Rules</u>

CODE OF CONDUCT - APPLIES TO ALL WHO ATTEND THE EISTEDDFOD.

- **DISRESPECTFUL AND INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR** –Disparaging remarks and Inappropriate behaviour towards volunteers, committee members, fellow competitors or teachers, will NOT be tolerated. Such incidents may lead to disqualification (withdrawal of prizes, monies, trophies, and scholarships) and/or exclusion from the venue.
- **SOCIAL MEDIA** Please be aware that defamation of character on social media towards any person involved in our Eisteddfod will not be tolerated and may result in disqualification or legal ramifications.
- **THEATRE ETIQUETTE** Show respect for competitors during and after their performances e.g. no whistling, yelling etc. Please do not enter or leave the theatre/auditorium when performers are on stage. This creates a distraction for all. Listen quietly to the adjudicator's comments.
 - 1. This competition is open to Amateurs only. i.e., people who do not derive their major income from performance.
 - ENTRIES:- are on-line through Stardom. : Click the <u>STARDOM ENTRIES</u> button on our website <u>www.orangeeisteddfod.org</u> ENTRIES ON STARDOM, UNPAID BY THE CLOSING TIME WILL BE DELETED. If you have difficulties with on-line entries, please contact us for help. An on-line admin fee will be \$5 per invoice. Method of payment will be credit/debit card only.
 - 3. No entries will be accepted or recorded unless accompanied by full entry fee.
 - 4. No refund will be made for an entry fee paid after the entry has been accepted.
 - In all competitions which are subject to an age limit, the age of the competitor shall be taken at the 31st December 2024.
 - 6. The Committee reserves the right to call upon any competitor at any time to provide a copy of his/her Birth Certificate and can withhold any prize until certificate has been produced.
 - 7. "Local" means a competitor living in an area with a 2800 postcode.
 - "Restricted" means never having won a first prize in that section at any age at any Eisteddfod or competition up to the closing date of entries 26 May 2024. (This refers to the title of the section, not the routine/piece.) Competitors eligible are permitted to enter Restricted or Non-restricted sections, or both, but must not repeat the same routine/piece.
 - 9. In all sections where 2 or more are competing in the same item, the name and date of birth of each competitor must be given at the time of entry, except in the case of groups.
 - 10. Competitors must <u>not</u> have been pupils of the adjudicator in the 6 months prior to the Eisteddfod.
 - 11. Entry fees are inclusive of copyright where applicable.
 - 12. Competitors enter at their own risk.
 - 13. There will be no printed programs NB. Download programs from the Orange Eisteddfod website <u>www.orangeeisteddfod.org</u>. A copy of the date and time of your performances can be found online at Stardom once the program is finalised.
 - 14. All care has been taken in the compilation of the Syllabus and Program and the Committee reserves the right to rectify any errors or omissions.
 - 15. Please check receipt of entries carefully and rectify errors or omissions immediately, as no alterations can be made after program is completed.

PERFORMANCES

- 16. The Committee reserves the right to amend the program at any time, to appoint a substitute or additional adjudicator, to divide or combine any sections or to alter competition times.
- 17. No competitor may compete more than once in any one section unless specific rules apply.
- 18. Competitors must be ready to take their place on the stage at the appointed time and in the order set down in the program.
- 19. No person may take another person's place in the program.
- 20. No medals are to be worn on stage.
- 21. No rehearsals are allowed on the stage of any venue during the Eisteddfod.
- 22. Please note that the use of inappropriate material in performances could lead to disqualification by the adjudicator.
- 23. No videos or photographs are to be taken of any performance with the exception of the official photographers. This includes the use of mobile phones, iPad or tablets.
- 24. All mobile phones are to be switched off in all venues during performances.
- 25. Audience members are asked not to enter or leave the venue while competitors are performing.

ADJUDICATION

- 26. The decision of the adjudicator is final unless a protest is lodged. Protests must be in writing on the page provided, setting out full details of the protest and accompanied by a deposit of \$20. If the protest is not upheld the deposit is forfeited.
- 27. Verbal grievances/complaints to individual Committee members, volunteers or other parents are not in the spirit of the Eisteddfod competition and will not be tolerated and could lead to exclusion from any further participation in the Eisteddfod.
- 28. The Adjudicator has the authority of the Committee to withhold or alter any prize which he/she is of the opinion that sufficient merit has not been displayed.
- 29. A report sheet from the Adjudicator will be available free of charge for competitors in each section.
- 30. If any competitor, teacher or parent approaches the Adjudicator before or during any section, the competitor may be disqualified.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

31. All electrical equipment brought into the performance venues must be checked by a Certified Electrician prior to the Eisteddfod and have a current electrical tag in place. Any electrical equipment not meeting the Workplace Health and Safety guidelines will not be allowed to be used.

COMPETITORS

32. The Committee reserves the right to use the competitor's details in the compilation of the program, including photographs for publicity purposes. If you do not wish to be photographed, it is the competitor's (or carer's) responsibility to notify an Orange Eisteddfod Committee person.

SPIRIT OF THE EISTEDDFOD

- The motto of our Eisteddfod is 'LEARN AND GROW THROUGH PERFORMANCE' and we aim to provide a supportive and encouraging environment where competitors can achieve their best.
- The Eisteddfod Committee values the positive contribution of a supportive and respectful audience to all competitors.

RULES FOR MUSIC SECTIONS

CODE OF CONDUCT - APPLIES TO ALL WHO ATTEND THE EISTEDDFOD.

- **DISRESPECTFUL AND INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR** –Disparaging remarks and Inappropriate behaviour towards volunteers, committee members, fellow competitors or teachers, will NOT be tolerated. Such incidents may lead to disqualification (withdrawal of prizes, monies, trophies, and scholarships) and/or exclusion from the venue.
- **SOCIAL MEDIA** Please be aware that defamation of character on social media towards any person involved in our Eisteddfod will not be tolerated and may result in disqualification or legal ramifications.
- **THEATRE ETIQUETTE** Show respect for competitors during and after their performances e.g. no whistling, yelling etc. Please do not enter or leave the theatre/auditorium when performers are on stage. This creates a distraction for all. Listen quietly to the adjudicator's comments.
- RESTRICTED means NOT having won a FIRST PRIZE in any solo instrumental or vocal section at any previous Eisteddfod. Eligible competitors are permitted to enter restricted sections, unrestricted sections, or both. The Restricted Rule applies up to the date of CLOSE OF ENTRIES OF THE EISTEDDFOD.
 The Committee reserves the right to use the competitor's details in the compilation of the program, including photographs for publicity purposes. If you do not want to be photographed, it is the competitor's (or carer's) responsibility to notify a member of the Orange Eisteddfod Committee.

<u>MUSIC</u>

- 3. In all sections, competitors must hand one (1) copy of the selected music/ music and words, to the Green Room person at least **20 MINUTES BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SESSION.** The Committee accepts no responsibility for the loss of, or damage to, any original works. Music should be printed, but if handwritten, it must be legible.
- 4. No competitor may perform the same item in more than one (1) section.
- 5. All music submitted must be clearly marked with SECTION NUMBER AND COMPETITOR'S NUMBER NO NAME OR SCHOOL SHOULD BE VISIBLE.
- 6. Complete the **MUSIC INFORMATION** page for each performance item. (See website for this page.)
- 7. ALL BARS IN MUSIC GIVEN TO THE ADJUDICATOR MUST BE NUMBERED.
- 8. Microphones allowed only in 'Popular Song', 'Open Contemporary Ensemble', 'Jazz/Stage Band' sections.

ACCOMPANIMENT

9. * A competitor should consider providing his/her own accompanist so that accompaniment is then assured. A list of accompanists is provided but availability of accompanists **cannot be guaranteed**.* Instrumental accompaniment (when available) is recommended for soloists other than pianists.

* PLEASE NOTE: ACCOMPANISTS ARE NO LONGER PROVIDED FREE OF CHARGE.
 Fees should be negotiated with the accompanists for their services and paid directly to them.
 ALL MUSIC MUST BE IN THE HANDS OF THE ACCOMPANIST AT LEAST 2 WEEKS BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE EISTEDDFOD.

<u>BACKING TRACK</u>: If live accompaniment is <u>unavailable</u>, a recording can be used as long as it is of a solo instrument which simulates a live , solo accompaniment. No vocals. NOTE: <u>Popular Song sections</u> 434, 435, 436 may use a backing track with a multi instrumental accompaniment but no vocals.

Choir sections may use a backing track with no vocals.

TIME LIMITS

10. Competitors must comply strictly with the **TIME LIMITS. TIME given is the total time allowed for singing or playing in that section, whether for one or two pieces.** Competitors will not be adjudicated after the specific time limit has elapsed. At the commencement of the music/song/piece, etc, the timekeeper will set the time to the appropriate time allowed for that section (the actual playing or singing time). Upon the time being reached, a bell will be rung, and adjudication will cease. A second bell may be rung if needed. Competitors who continue after the time limit has elapsed may not be awarded a prize and a comment about the time excess will be noted on the comment sheet.

PLEASE KEEP TO THE ALLOCATED TIME LIMITS.

COMPETITORS' EQUIPMENT

Competitors' equipment must be brought into the venue through the door provided ½ an hour before each session. All equipment must be removed from the stage and venue at the conclusion of each session.
 IT IS THE COMPETITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT ALL ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT IS SAFETY CHECKED AND TAGGED.

PRESENTATION OF PRIZES:

12. Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator, especially when there is only one competitor.
Presentation of prizes will be as follows, wherever possible:
Major prizes and medals are to be presented on the stage following the adjudication.
Money prizes are to be collected from the Office.
The onus is on the competitor to collect all prizes, medals, certificates, reports, money and music etc.

WINNERS OF SCHOLARSHIP SECTIONS:

13. <u>Scholarship winners</u> are NOT eligible to enter these sections again until three (3) years have elapsed. <u>Scholarship entrants</u> must have competed in at least two (2) other solo sections of the same discipline to be eligible to enter the Scholarship section.

<u>Scholarship entrants</u> to perform two contrasting pieces, neither of which has been performed in previous sections.

<u>Scholarship entrants</u> must study music in Orange, and scholarship money is to be used for music tuition from a teacher in Orange.

GRADE SECTIONS:

14. <u>Selection of music</u>: Competitors should choose a piece of music which is listed in the AMEB syllabus for the grade they have entered this year.

DUETS

15. Instrumental Duet is when two (2) instruments are played together using music specifically written for a "duet", not a solo instrument with accompaniment.

A **Vocal Duet** is when two (2) singers sing together in two - part harmony (not in unison). The names and dates of birth of both performers must be provided when entering a duet section. <u>NEW *A competitor may perform twice in a section with different partners.</u>

COPYRIGHT RULE

16. The competitor may hand in a music photocopy for the use of the adjudicator, provided that it has been made from an original music work. However the photocopy must be destroyed by the Eisteddfod committee at the end of the section, and it cannot be handed back to the competitor. NB <u>Original music</u> provided for the use of the adjudicator will be handed back to the competitor at the end of the section.

BANDS/ENSEMBLES/CHOIRS:

CHOIRS:

Maximum of 100 voices per choir, unless other numbers are specified in the section description.

- 17. Leaders must hand their music (for the Adjudicator) to the Office officials at least 20 minutes before the session begins.
- 18. Leaders must submit to the Office officials a list of members of the Band/ Ensemble/ Choir performing in each section. This is to comply with the Workplace, Health and Safety rules of the venues.
- 19. It is the responsibility of the leader to notify the Office before the performance of <u>permission to photograph</u> <u>the group.</u>
- 20. The performers in each group should be bona fide members of that group.
- 21. Organisations can enter more than one group in a section as long as each group has a unique identity.
- 22. <u>No teachers</u> are permitted to perform with any group, other than in Special Needs and Open sections.
- 23. Bands and School Ensembles/Choirs will perform at the Orange Function Centre, Eyles St, Orange.
- 24. Bands perform on the floor area of the Function Centre not on stage, unless advised by the Committee.
- 25. No piano will be available for bands on Band Day.
- 26. Groups need to bring their own equipment music stands, extension leads, CD Players if needed for Percussion Bands, school choirs, etc.
- 27. All electrical equipment is to be checked and tagged and is the responsibility of the competitors.
- 28. On Band Day, leaders are asked to ensure that equipment and instruments are stored neatly and compactly to avoid damage to them and that players are quiet while performances are taking place.

PIANO SECTIONS:

29. Extra devices cannot be brought on to the stage or attached to the piano.

THE PROGRAM:

30. THERE WILL BE NO CHANGE MADE TO THE PRINTED PROGRAM. Please check entries with your teacher as soon as you receive the receipt. Contact us if incorrect as no changes will be made after the program is finalised. If your AMEB music examination is scheduled on your performance day and time, then please notify a committee member 7 days before your programmed time. You are then required to produce your appointment schedule letter to the committee member. Two or more committee members will decide if you can be allocated a different spot. You can then be adjudicated but not given a place in the scoring list. This rule will be strictly adhered to. You are then eligible to enter a Scholarship Section.

ENCOURAGEMENT AWARDS:

- <u>The City of Orange Eisteddfod Pianoforte Encouragement Award Trophy</u> for a competitor who performed in any restricted piano sections 8 -12 years.
- Melissa Buchholz's Encouragement Trophies for * a Junior Band, * a primary age woodwind soloist
- <u>An Orange Regional Conservatorium voucher</u> valued at \$250 (to be redeemed at the ORC e.g. for lesson payment, instrument hire, concert tickets) as an encouragement award to a competitor in each of these scholarship sections: i.e. Senior Piano, Senior Strings, Senior Woodwind, Senior Brass, Vocal
- <u>RIBBONS</u> will be awarded to each competitor in Additional Needs sections.

CHORAL SECTIONS

Maximum of 100 voices per choir unless other numbers are specified in the section description.

PLEASE READ RULES SECTION: BANDS, ENSEMBLES, CHOIRS BEFORE COMPLETING ENTRY.

- 401. Stage 2 Primary School Choir (Years 3 & 4). Two contrasting songs. Own choice. Minimum 12 voices; Maximum 100 voices 8 mins time limit
- 402. Stage 3 Primary School Choir (Years 5 & 6) Two contrasting songs. One song to be performed in at least two (2) parts. Minimum 12 voices; Maximum 100 voices

- 403. Mixed Age Youth Choir –
 Up to School Stage 3
 Two (2) contrasting songs. Children not necessarily from any one school.
 Maximum 100 voices
 8 mins time limit
- 404. Small School Choir –
